HealthFinders Collaborative

HealthFinders Collaborative (HFC) evolved from caring people at St. Dominic Church in Northfield who recognized the need to improve healthcare access in the community. HFC now consists of two community offices, located in Northfield and Faribault.

We are a community organization providing *quality* healthcare, advocacy, and wellness education for people with limited healthcare alternatives.

A dedicated group of staff and volunteer medical providers, nurses, interpreters, and receptionists, plus support and services from local hospitals and community and health system partners and organizations, makes this work possible.

Volunteers Meet Community Needs

Our volunteers are invaluable partners, delivering critical services and support. Not only do volunteers help us extend our resources, but their expertise and passion provides a unique quality of care and builds community within our clinic.



Volunteer Roles

Student Interns

Through student internships during the school year and summer, interns gain experience by working in clinical operations, interpreting, dental assistance, communications and development, healthy lifestyles programming, and more. Students execute research studies, which mutually benefit HFC's community!

Receptionists

Volunteer receptionists serve as a welcoming presence at HealthFinders and are responsible for greeting patients, administrative tasks and excellent customer service. Basic language skills in Spanish/Somali preferred, but not required.

▶ Medical Providers

Volunteer providers (D.O., M.D., N.P., and P.A.) provide quality medical treatment/primary care and follow-up for a diverse patient population. They partner with patients and collaborate with other clinic volunteers and staff to improve patient outcomes. Must be licensed to practice in Minnesota.



Nurses, Clinical Assistants, and Lab Specialists

Volunteer nurses (LPNs or RNs), medical assistants, EMTs, Certified Nursing Assistants (CNAs), phlebotomist/lab techs, and/or student nurses provide patient care and clinic support according to their license and experience. Nurses and medical assistants work independently to carry out patient intake processes, patient education, and point-of-care testing and assist with procedures, preparation, and coordination. EMTs, CNAs, and student nurses take vital signs, assist with patient flow, and provide clinic support.

▶ Dental Providers

Volunteer dentists, Registered Dental Assistants, dental therapists, and Registered Dental Hygienists provide quality dental treatment and patient follow-up. Duties include patient assessment and treatment, hard and soft tissue assessment, patient education, and clinic support. Must be licensed to practice in Minnesota.

▶ Interpreters

Volunteer interpreters come from a range of backgrounds, speaking Spanish or Somali, and assist with cross-cultural communication between patients and the care team. They help with medical/clinic interpretation, as well as group and individual interpretation for educational sessions and classes. Interpreters must be fluent and willing to expand their vocabulary to include medical terminology.
